ToT OBJECTIVES - In this 3-day Training, participants can expect to...

... learn about the Sustainable Development Goals and how they are **best approached and acted** on at a national and local level to realize tangible and measurable successes by 2030;

... **prioritise the Goals** that are particularly important for their own country / community and identify projects, resources, partners and strategies to support project-centered implementation of specific SDGs;

... **design strategies** for how to mobilize different stakeholders to support and participate in local and regional SDG initiatives;

... identify **effective ways to spread awareness** of and support for the SDGs throughout their community and beyond.



PROGRAMME OVERVIEW



‘Localizing’ is the process of taking into account subnational contexts in the achievement of the 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Localization relates both to how the SDGs can provide a framework for local development policy and to how local and regional governments and other stakeholders can support the achievement of the SDGs through action from the bottom up. This ToT workshop will provide individuals with the knowledge, tools, methods and network for effectively putting into action the global goals at the national and sub-national level.

This Training of Trainers is structure around 3 Modules to meet the training objectives.

Day 1/ Module 1 focuses on the ‘Big Picture’ of the SDGs. Starting with a foundational background on what the SDGs are, as well as participants’ own knowledge and interaction with the SDGs in their work, Module 1 will focus on the four key attributes of the SDG framework: universal, inclusive, indivisible and transformative; through games, group work, discussion and participant presentations.

Day 2/Module 2 will focus on ‘Strategic Advocacy and Action Planning’. The first part of the module will introduce and explore, through plenary open dialogue, as well as a role-play game, the art of issue (or goal/target) advocacy and building multi-stakeholder support for one’s ideas and initiatives. The second part of the module will focus on plans and tools for strategic or integrated planning at the local level in the participants own target communities. All the information, tool and methods provided in the module can be adapted to other situations and context as well.

Day 3/Module 3 will provide practical example in localizing action on SDGs in northern Thailand. We will have a special guest lecturer from a well-known and highly effective local leader, change agent and entrepreneur followed by an on-sight field visit to see for ourselves how local action is done and achievers measurable results. The module wraps up with an open discussion and mapping towards building a sustainable collaborative network among participants and others.

The training aims to conclude with recommendations based on the discussions and examples provided by participants, as well as, a roadmap to follow the localization process in the region, based on further networking and cooperation opportunities.
